Women's unequal participation in decision-making processes reinforces inequalities and prevents them from fully contributing to the planning, development and implementation of climate-related policies.

Women leading the change for climate

Yet, women play a critical role in response to climate change due to their local knowledge of and leadership in climate related issues. According to a study, countries with more women in parliament were more likely to ratify environmental treaties, reflecting higher support for environmental protection (UNDP, 2011).
